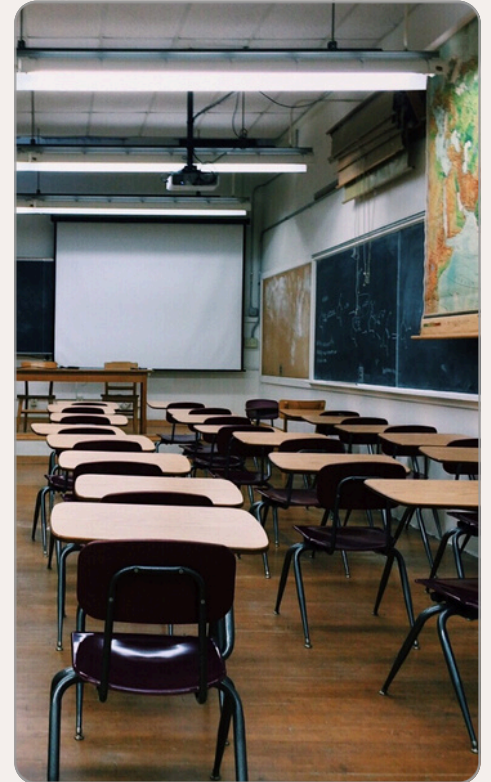

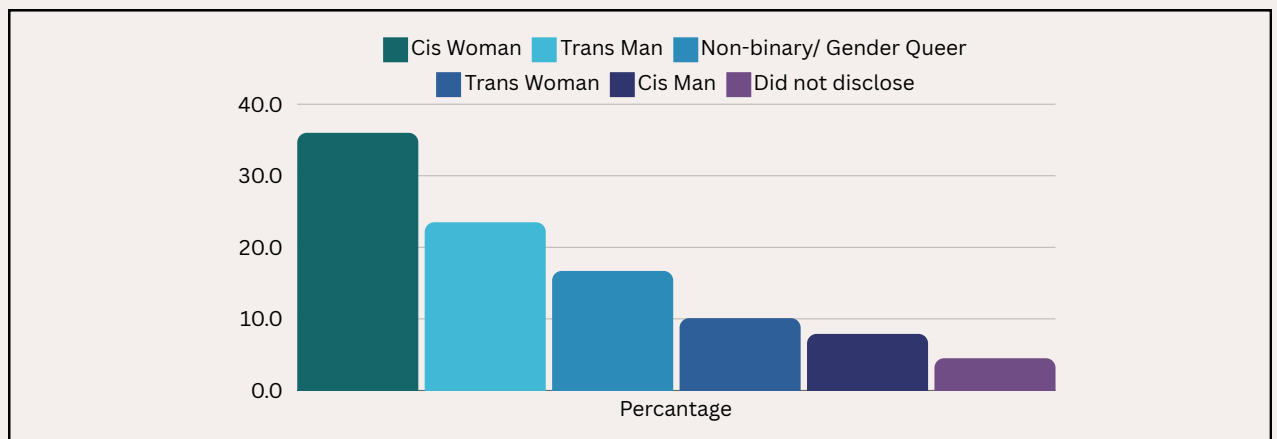
## From January 2023 to March 2023:

The Rainbow Education Coalition of Los Angeles (RECLA) gathered information from:

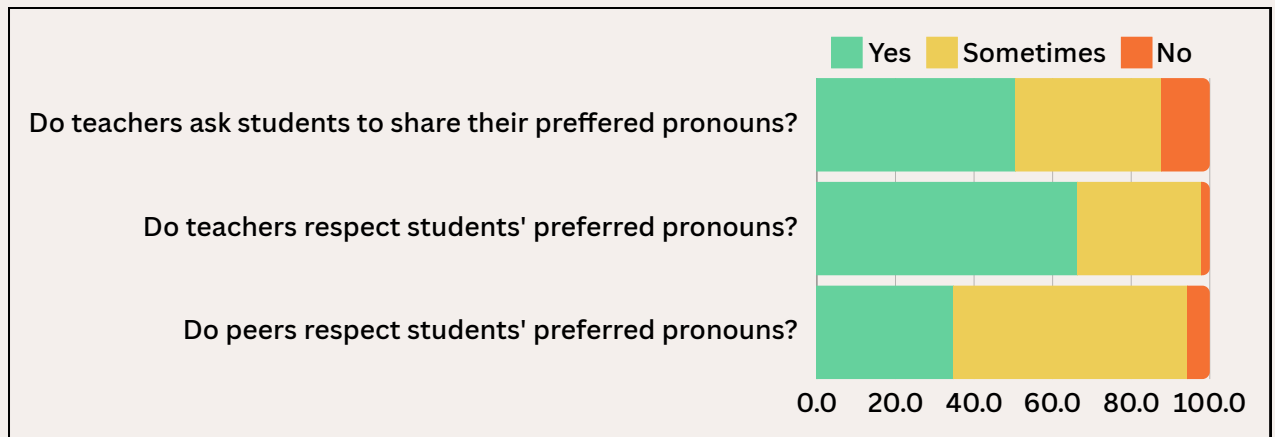
- 90 total survey respondents
- 50 LAUSD schools
- **100% LGBTQ+ students**
- 95% were high school students

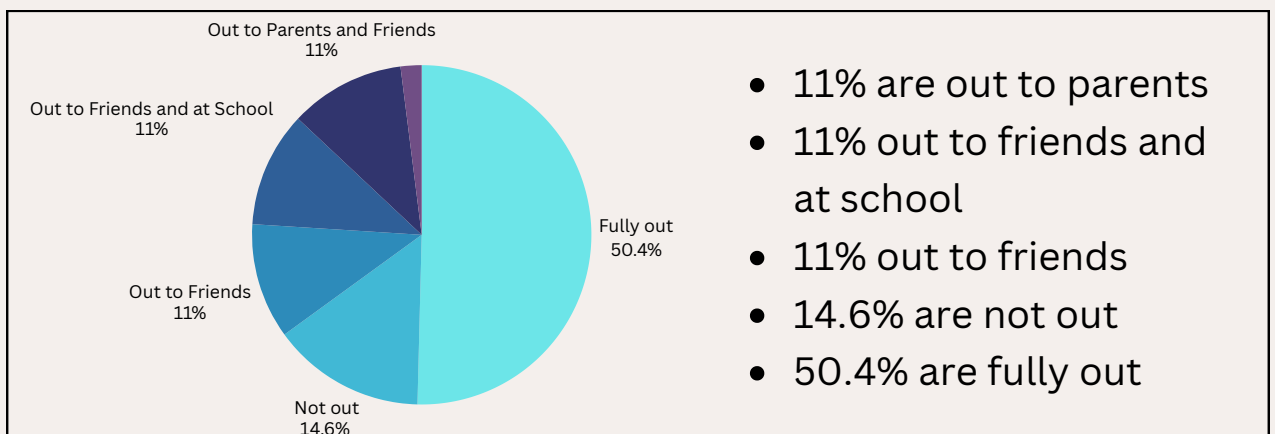

#### IF YOU IDENTIFY AS LGBTQ+, ARE YOU "OUT"?



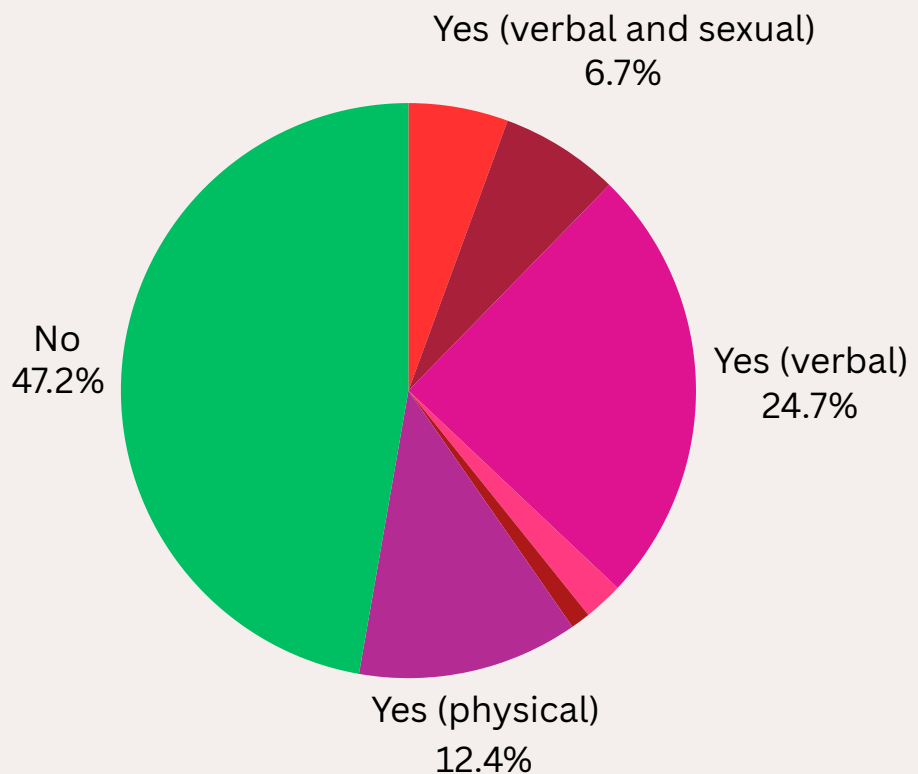
- 11% are out to parents
- 11% out to friends and at school
- 11% out to friends
- 14.6% are not out
- 50.4% are fully out

## The following are some of the results on their experiences within 2023:

### LGBTQIA+ VISIBILITY:

- **77.5%** of students reported **having a GSA or Pride club at their schools.**
- **65.2%** of students reported their schools supporting the queer and trans student body with **specialized programs and events (Pride month events, activities, etc.)**
- **56.2%** of students reported having **learned about LGBTQ+ history, movements, and/or people at school.**
- **92.1%** of students reported **they can identify at least one teacher on campus supportive of LGBTQ+ students.**

### HAVE YOU EXPERIENCED HARASSMENT, BULLYING, AND/OR ASSAULT ON CAMPUS?:



- More than half of the students surveyed said they experience a form of harassment in their school.
- Verbal harassment was the most reported type of harassment experienced among students.

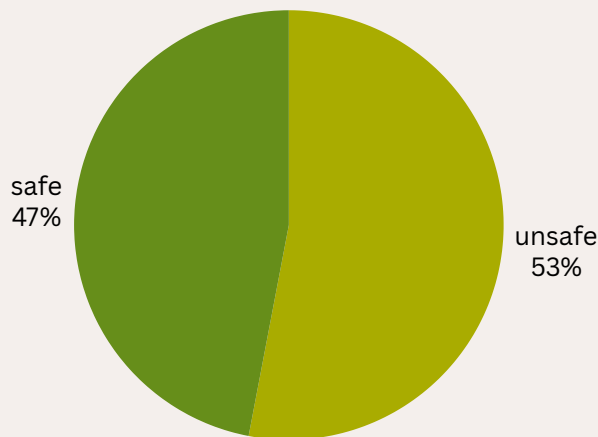


41.6% of students that experienced harassment/assault on campus did not report it to a teacher or school staff member.



9% of students that **did report** the assault/harassment **felt it was not handled effectively.**

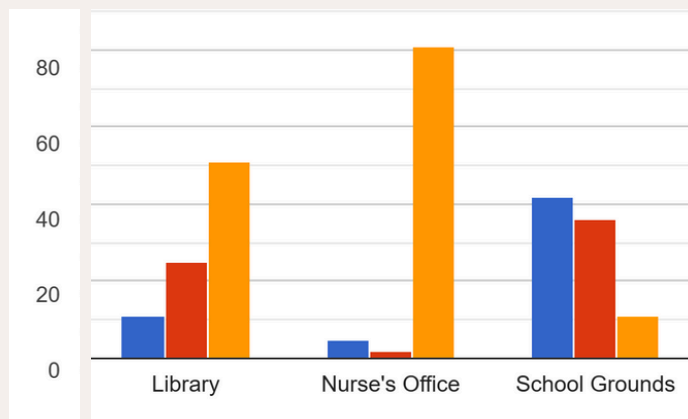
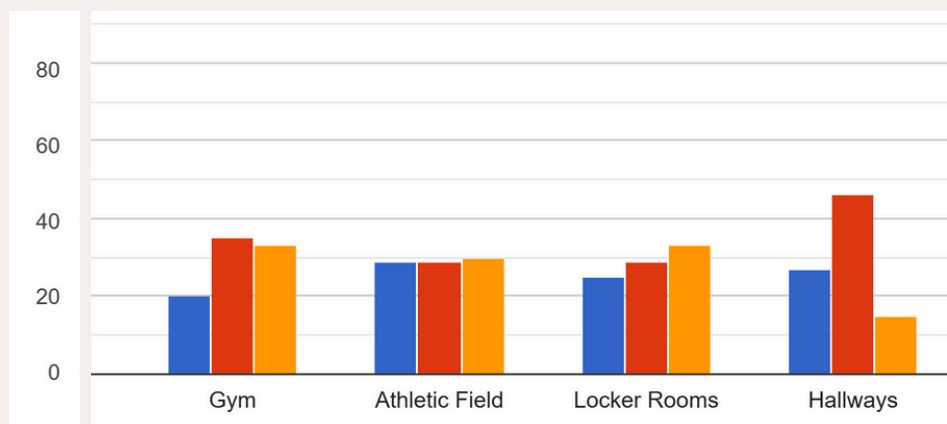
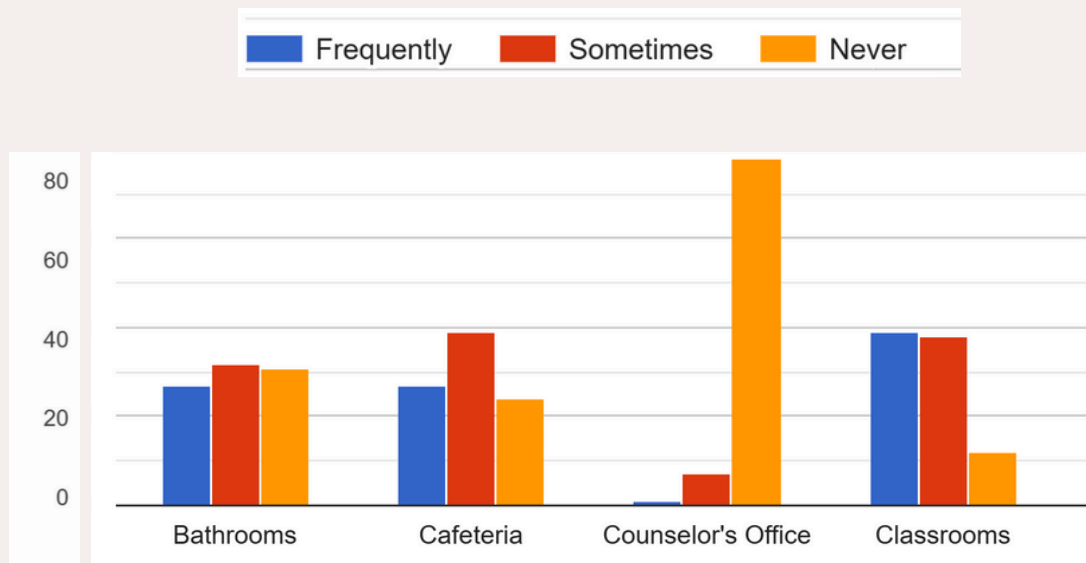


- 24% don't feel safe because of their sexual orientation
- 13% don't feel safe because if their gender identity/expression
- 7% don't feel safe because if their race/ethnicity
- 7% don't feel safe because of all three factors mentioned above

**OTHER  
COLLECTED  
DATA:**

- In the past year, 64% of students have felt excluded or "left out" on purpose at school.
- In the past year, 60% of students have heard racist remarks at school on a frequent basis.
